You have demonstrated experience in providing excellent customer service skills and excel at embracing diversity while establishing rapport with clients. Your preferred post-secondary or secondary education is complemented with related experience. Ideally, you have office experience and proficient in using Microsoft Office Products.

Under the direction of the Executive Director and in co-operation with the staff, each Summer Student Advisor will assume responsibility for assisting in the enhancement of the education and training to employment related services to meet the needs of First Nations Clients and Employers based in traditional Anishinabek values and principles for the Aboriginal people of the participating First Nations. One Summer Student Advisor will focus on assisting with Systems and/or Information Technology activities, and the other Advisor will focus on marketing and finance related activities.

Post-Secondary (College or University) or Secondary Student Applicants between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of employment; registered as full-time students in the previous academic year and intend to return to school on a full-time basis in the next academic year; Canadian citizens, permanent residents or persons to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act; and legally entitled to work in Canada.
