Anishinabek Employment & Training Services (AETS) is partnering with Biigtigong Nishnaabeg to host a Land-Based Learning conference for educators, education professionals, administrators, community Leadership, and program facilitators.

This multi-day event will feature the experience of Biigtigong Nishnaabeg and their successful implementation of Land-Based Learning throughout standard curriculum. Sessions include the organization and planning of seasonal activities such as hunting and harvesting; how Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) concepts are bridged with traditional knowledge and storytelling; and how this type of learning can be assessed outside the predominant Western perspective.

Elder-led ceremony will be interwoven throughout the conference, including a two-minute silence on November 11th for Remembrance Day. The complete agenda, facilitator details and registration can be found at the online event portal: aets.live/portal.
