Indigenous Labour Market Information (LMI) Survey

Did you know there is a lack of workforce information available about First Nations?

The LMI project explores employmentrelated data from working age (fifteen or older) Indigenous Citizens on/off reserves. Approval has been granted by each of the nine participating First Nations, for the purpose of collecting data that reflects a community's overall available workforce, including knowledge, skills and abilities.

AETS will be able to analyze the data with each community and use it to remove barriers and improve education, training, and employment-related programs and services for community members.

The project commenced in 2019, with 44 other First Nation Communites. Since the start, there are now over 70 First Nations across Canada participating.

Participant Survey Eligibility

Participants who meet the below criteria will be eligible for applicable incentives and draws:

- 1. Community member of one of the participating First Nation Communities (living on or off reserve),
- 2. Age fifteen or older,
- 3. Has been a minimum of ten months since you completed the last LMI survey.

Financial Incentive? YES!

Survey participants who meet the eligibility criteria will receive a **\$10 Tim Card** for each annual survey completed.



In addition to the \$10, your name will be entered into a draws to **win up to \$1,000 cash!**

All you have to do to is complete a survey and you will automatically be entered to win!

Participant Confidentiality:

Information shared in the Indigenous Labour Market Information Survey will remain confidential. This means that only the LMI Team will have access to the data that identifies you with your responses.
