

Project Background

The Margaret Anderson Foundation was created (2011) to specifically assist in the advancement of education, employment opportunities and cultural preservation for First Nation People in the Thunder Bay Region.

Anishinabek Employment and Training Services (AETS) and Fort William First Nation (FWFN), in partner-ship with the Lakehead Adult Education Centre (LAEC) and the Margaret Anderson Foundation, are launching the First Nations PREP program that will focus on assisting First Nation Citizens meet their meaningful employment goals. The collaboration will engage off-reserve First Nation members from the AETS communities as well as on-reserve FWFN members, in a holistic approach to service co-ordination that has the following objectives:

- 1.Employment counselling to develop customized action plans that could include apprenticeships, postsecondary education and/or meaningful employment pathways.
- 2. Education pathways (may include Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or academic upgrading).
 - 3. Cultural programming and co-ordination.
 - 4. On-going support and case management.
