

LONG HAUL TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING PROGRAM INFO: (15 WEEK PROGRAM)

Confederation College's training program prepares individuals for an opportunity to become a licensed truck driver, specializing in long haul truck driving. This training program is 15 weeks in duration and consists of:

In-School and In-Cab training (10 weeks) provides the learners with all the necessary skills and knowledge to achieve their AZ accreditation as delivered through the Ministry of Transportation's approved Mandatory Entry Level Training (MELT) and the Long Haul Truck specific modules and mentorship portion (5 weeks) that will allow the successful students to enter the workforce in a number of sectors, including energy, forestry and mining.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (or equivalent) with courses from the College (C), University (U), University/College (U/C), or Open (O) preparation levels with Grade 12 English (C/U) Level.
- Or successful completion of the Mature Student Assessment.
- Or successful completion of the General Education Development Test (GED).
- Or appropriate credits from the Academic and Career Entrance program (ACE).
- Class G Driver's License
- MTO Driver's Medical
- Recent MTO Driver's Abstract

COURSE INFORMATION:

This course will run from Monday to Friday – 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. – for 15 weeks. Students will be provided with all personal protective equipment (PPE).

EVALUATION:

Students will be evaluated at the end of each section. Individual instructors will discuss evaluation procedures in their respective subject areas. Specific tests will be administered in WHMIS and First Aid. Students must meet attendance requirements.

Grades for the AZ In-Cab, Mentorship and Modular Training will be a credit or non credit.

CREDENTIALS:

At the successful completion of the program, participants will receive a Confederation College "Recognition of Achievement."
